Next up, from Saturday, September 24th until Sunday, October 2nd, Visit Woodstock GA will celebrate Oktoberfest, or actually, WDSTKtoberfest, in Downtown Woodstock.

WDSTKtoberfest will kick off on Saturday, September 24th with a keg tapping event featuring Woodstock Mayor Michael Caldwell. On Saturday, October 1st, there will be a pub crawl from 2pm to 6pm. Participating restaurants will offer Bavarian food and beverage specials during the event and Visit Woodstock GA will give away \$50 gift cards in prize drawings. Some restaurants will offer specials during the week and on the weekends, and others will offer specials only on the weekends. On pub crawl day, when participants arrive at their first restaurant, they will be given an entry form. For each restaurant visited, they will receive a stamp on their form. Once they have received five stamps, they may redeem their form at the Visit Woodstock GA tent for a boot glass with the

WOODSTOCK ANNOUNCES PARTIAL PROPERTY TAX ROLLBACK

The City of Woodstock Mayor and Council considered a partial property tax rollback at three public hearings at meetings during the month of August. The public hearings took place on Monday August 8, Monday August 15 and Monday August 22, 2022 at the Chambers at City Center.

The public hearings were held in compliance with state legal requirements for a partial millage rate rollback. The fiscal year 2023 budget which took effect on July 1, 2022 was originally based upon a full rollback of the millage rate to 5.198 mills. Recent essential increases to police, public works, and parks and recreation compensation have resulted in a proposed partial rollback from the 2021 rate of 5.981 mills to 5.693 mills. These adjustments, approved on July 18, 2022 were necessary to remain competitive in a shrinking labor market while combatting increasing national inflation. This will be the tenth year in a row the City Council has held steady or reduced the millage rate.

"Our Council is once again lowering our property tax rate to protect our taxpayers from the effects of increasing property values. This year's proposed reduction to 5.693 mills from 5.981 mills represents the lowest rate possible while also making an important investment in our city's police officer pay," said Mayor Michael Caldwell. "I am proud of Council for balancing these vitally important priorities to ensure we maintain some of the lowest taxes and remain one of the safest communities in the State of Georgia."

Eligible property owners can file for a Homestead Exemption through the tax assessor's office. This exemption provides a freeze on inflationary increase in value on certain taxes after the base year. The estimated annual tax relief due to the proposed partial rollback to 5.693 mills compared to the tax valuations and estimated tax assessments property owners received based upon the current millage rate are as follows:

- Property owners with a fair market value of \$350,000 can expect a \$40.32 reduction compared to their received assessment estimates.
- Property owners with a fair market value of \$575,000 can expect a \$66.24 reduction compared to their received assessment estimates.

INCREASE IN PAY FOR POLICE, PUBLIC WORKS, AND PARKS & RECREATION

At the Special Called Meeting of Mayor and Council on July 18th, 2022, the Woodstock City Council unanimously approved an overhaul of the city's compensation plan that includes raises for police, public works, and parks & recreation employees.

"This increase represents the largest single pay increase for our officers in Department history, and accounts for nearly a 25% increase since the start of the calendar year," Mayor Michael Caldwell said. "The City of Woodstock is investing in the men and women who keep our city safe and we are actively competing for the very best officers in Georgia."

The compensation plan plan is to help address the monetary compensation issues that are impacting the Woodstock Police Department in recruiting and retention, according to City Manager Jeff Moon.



"We are grateful to the Mayor, City Council, and City Manager for their unanimous support in approving a compensation plan that offers more money to our current and future officers," Chief Robert Jones said in a statement. "Woodstock Police Department has always been a top agency in the metro-Atlanta area. This new plan will keep us competitive amongst other agencies; thus, retaining and recruiting the best in the business to serve and protect Woodstock."

All raises and changes to the compensation plan took place with the July 28 payroll period.

The City of Woodstock's Community Development Department is responsible for managing the current and long-term growth of the city through the administration of the zoning code and the comprehensive town plan. The department is made up of the Planning and Zoning Division, the Land Development Office, the Building Department, Code Enforcement, and the Development Services Office. The City of Woodstock's Economic Development Department works with its private and public partners to continue to identify and develop the types of product it wants to attract to the City, retain its existing business and industry, support the growth of entrepreneurs and startups and market its assets to those it wants to attract and retain.


9/11 DAY OF REMEMBRANCE



WPD LIFESAVING AWARDS

LIFE SAVING AWARDS: At last night's meeting of the Mayor and City Council, Command Staff recognized the following officers for life saving actions which met the department's standard to receive the meritorious WPD's life saving award.

Incident on April 26, 2022: Officer Hinkle and Officer Brown

Incident on May 5, 2022: Officer Dixon

Incident on June 9, 2022: Officer Dixon, Officer Bitzer, and Officer Gross

On April 26th, Officers Justin Hinkle and Robert Brown responded to a domestic dispute at an apartment complex off Arnold Mill Road. While conducting their investigation, the alleged suspect jumped out of the bedroom window of the second-floor apartment. During the subsequent fall to the ground, this individual struck the first-floor window of the apartment below before striking the ground and sustained life-threatening injuries. Both officers immediately ran to where the victim was and began treating the injuries. Officer Hinkle placed a tourniquet on the left leg of the victim while Officer Brown tried to talk to and keep the victim from losing consciousness. For their actions on April 26th, 2022, Officers Hinkle and Brown are hereby awarded the Woodstock Police Department's Life Saving Award. On May 5th, 2022 a call came out in reference to a 2 year old child not breathing a an apartment complex. Officer Barron Dixon was on his way home, off duty, and heard the call. He immediately responded to the apartment where the young child was in distress and made contact with the mother and child. The child was lying on his back, not breathing, and appeared lifeless. The mother was on the phone with 911. Officer Dixon began chest compressions while the mother was attempting to breathe life back into the child. Moments later, the child opened his eyes and was conscious. For his actions on May 5th, 2022, Officer Dixon is hereby awarded the Woodstock Police Department's Life Saving Award.

On June 9th, 2022, Officers Barron Dixon, Ben Bitzer, and Scott Gross responded to a stabbing call at a residence off of Hwy 92. When they arrived on scene, they discovered the suspect who was taken into custody without issue. These officers then located two victims, both with multiple, critical wounds. These officers worked together, providing extensive medical care to both victims, and assisted Fire and EMS personnel with getting the victims to the ambulance. For their actions on June 9th, 2022, Officers Dixon, Bitzer, and Gross are hereby awarded the Woodstock Police Department's Life Saving Award.


