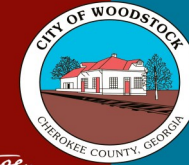

WHERE DO I VOTE?

The precinct for the City of Woodstock's Municipal Election and for County Advanced Voting is the Woodstock Public Library located at 7735 Main Street, Woodstock, GA.



VOTING TIPS/REMINDERS:

- You can register to vote or change your voter registration online.
- You can request your absentee ballot by mail online! No reason necessary.
- If the County, State or Federal Government has an election at the same time as the Municipal Election—then **SAVE TIME!** You have two options:
 - 1) Vote early (formerly known as absentee voting) by mail or in person at the Cherokee County Elections Office in Canton (770 479-0407) up to 21 days prior to the election; or
 - 2) You can participate in Advanced Voting for both elections the week prior to Nov. 7th at the Woodstock Public Library or Canton Election Office (400 N. Main St, Canton) and avoid having to go to two precincts on Election Day.
- Last Day to Register to Vote for Nov. 7th is October 10th..
