VOTING TIPS/REMINDERS

You can register to vote or change your voter registration
online.

You can request your absentee ballot by mail online! No
reason necessary.

If the County, State or Federal Government has an election
at the same time as the Municipal Election—then **SAVE
TIME!** You have two options:

- 1) Vote early (formerly known as absentee voting) by mail or
in person at the Cherokee County Elections Office in
Canton (770 479-0407) up to 21 days prior to the election;
or
- 2) You can participate in Advance Voting for both elections
the week prior to Nov. 7th at the Woodstock Public Library
or Canton Election Office (400 N. Main St, Canton) and
avoid having to go to two precincts on Election Day.

Last Day to Register to Vote for Nov. 7th is October 10th.

EARLY VOTING: Cherokee County Elections Office ONLY

M-F October 16-27—8:30 am to 5 pm

ADVANCE VOTING: Cherokee Elections & Woodstock Public
Library—M-F October 30-November 3—8:30 am to 5 pm

ELECTION DAY: Must vote at your assigned precinct for
City and County Election

WHY VOTE?

- ◆ By voting in the municipal election YOU decide who is going to
be making daily decisions in local government; who will listen
to YOUR complaints and who will fight for YOUR rights.
- ◆ Local City Government makes decisions affecting your
neighborhood...from urban growth, to speed bumps and
traffic lights, to roadway improvements.
- ◆ Your safety and security is determined by decisions the
elected officials make regarding police and fire services.
The City Council is the ultimate decision maker for
everything from budgets, personnel needs and policies to
equipment purchases and infrastructure improvements.
- ◆ Local City Government makes decisions about greenspace
requirements, parks, trails, events, etc.
- ◆ Local City Government determines the amount of property
taxes you pay and how that money is spent. The decisions
they make regarding types of development, zoning
regulations and more affect your quality of life and your
property values.
- ◆ The quality of the water you drink, the air you breathe and the
aesthetics of the City are determined by the decisions of the
Council. Water wells, sewer treatment plant improvements,
stormwater management and tree preservation ordinances
all play a role in your quality of life.
- ◆ The real question is.....WHY NOT VOTE?
